## *Bond Briefs*



On Tuesday, August 4th, Waterford School District residents will vote on a no tax rate increase bond proposal.

**The August 4th bond proposal is about enhancing the learning environment and protecting the community's investment in its school district.**

### The bond proposal calls for:

1. expanding student safety and school security measures;
2. upgrading classrooms, heating and cooling systems, fire alarm systems, music equipment, and athletic equipment;
3. updating technology and technology infrastructure;
4. replacing items that have reached the end of their life expectancy, including roofs, lighting, flooring, furniture, and school buses;
5. constructing a new Early Childhood Center; and,
6. renovating classrooms and media centers to safely address teacher-student interaction and collaboration.

### *Basic Bond Briefs*



Every project in the bond proposal has been reviewed and approved by the Michigan Department of Treasury.



**If voters approve the bond proposal, the current tax rate will not increase.** In fact, the tax rate is projected to remain at or below the current levy. (Note that the millage rate declined 0.25 mills in 2019 and will remain at or below that lowered amount.)

### *More Bond Briefs*



The \$150 million bond proposal is designed to help assure that Waterford's schools are safe, secure, up-to-date, and in good condition.



Projects funded through a successful bond election will affect every Waterford student and every Waterford school and school facility.



Bond proposal revenue will be used to provide current technology for student instruction and the infrastructure to support it.



All bond proposal renovations and upgrades will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).



Registered voters can vote at the polls on August 4th or by absentee ballot anytime between June 20th and Election Day.

After June 20th, absentee ballots will be mailed to those who apply for them.
