Some of our seniors are homebound and enjoy reading this newsletter and receiving home delivered meals. We have members who come in only for special programs like; our Senior Health Expo, Medicare Assistance or AARP Tax Program. Of course the special holiday events are always popular along with the Flea Market and Bake Sale each summer plus the big Craft Show each fall. We have the only Flight Simulation experience in our area and we have a Woodshop that hosts woodcarving classes too! Our Gift Shop is a popular stop for shoppers who want that special handmade item for a unique gift. The guilters meet twice a week and the Comfort Makers have donated over 400 blankets, baby hats and lap robes so far this year to hospitals and shut- ins. We are home base to the Waterford Garden Club and the Taking Pounds off Sensibly group as well. The Waterford Jammers meet each Thursday and welcome all who want to play an instrument, sing or just enjoy the music. Of course the Bistro is full at lunch time with overflow seating in the hallway for the most popular meals. Where else can seniors gather for a tasty, nutritious meal for a \$3.00 donation? Our Lunch and Learn speakers provide interesting topics that help us with information to promote healthy aging. The Encore program is a social model adult day care that operates 5 days a week providing respite care allowing seniors to live in their home setting with family. Of course our WSC is booming with activities such as cards, bunco, Wii bowling group, art, craft and painting classes. We have book club, exercise, yoga, meditation and two different Tai Chi classes. Our Waterford Senior Center is a TREASURE in our community!



Can you Benefit from Meals-on-Wheels?

⇒ What are Meals-on-Wheels?

The Meals-on-Wheels program provides a tasty, hot, nutritious noon-time meal to Waterford's homebound seniors. The program is based on individual nutritional needs not income. The hot noon meal provides one third (1/3rd) of average daily nutritional requirements. Optional cold evening meals and frozen weekend meals are also available. Another benefit is a daily reassurance visit from our dedicated volunteer drivers.

The Meals-on-Wheels program is administered by the Waterford Senior Center.

⇒ How does it work?

You may order meals to be delivered Monday through Friday between 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. A volunteer driver will deliver the meal right to your door!

⇒ Who is eligible for the meals?

- A person must be 60 years or older.
- Must be homebound; does not leave the home under normal circumstances.
- Must live in Waterford.
- A person must be unable to obtain food or prepare complete meals.
- The persons dietary needs must be appropriately met by the program.
- The person must be able to feed themselves, or have a caregiver that can assist.
- A person must agree to be home when meals are delivered, or contact the program when absence is unavoidable.

⇒ But what about the cost?

The meals are provided to you on a "donation only" basis. This means that it is your decision as to whether you are able to pay for the meals or not. The amount of \$3.00 per meal is suggested.

⇒ Great! How do I get started?

A new, online educational platform offered by AgeWays Nonprofit Senior Services (formerly called the Area Agency on Aging 1-B) offers caregivers an easy way to get information and advice online. It's also free!

Trualta's learning modules, on subjects ranging from handling a loved one's resistance to taking medications to managing pressure wounds can be read, listened to or watched. There are resources, articles, checklists, videos, quizzes, and webinars to choose from. There is a chat function so caregivers can learn from each other and support groups. Trualta has recruited experts for the platform. For example, Teepa Snow, a renowned expert on dementia caregiving, offers her tips for a positive approach to caregiving. Trualta keeps content up to date and adds new learning opportunities (in Spanish, too!) each month.

To use Trualta, the family caregiver and/or the older adult (60 and older) must live in one of the six counties served by AgeWays (Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, and Washtenaw).




