Every artist learns by working under the tutelage of a highly-qualified mentor that helps them tell their story through whatever art form speaks to them, including music, animation, voice acting, gaming, claymation, theatre, and more. Tink Tank Animate also hosts award shows and helps artists sell their works to publicly validate their accomplishments, earn income, and inspire others.

Tink Tank Animate also provides mental health support through their expressive arts therapy program. The program offers a safe and creative environment for individuals and their families to explore their emotions and foster resilience. By integrating art and creative expression into therapeutic practices, they empower participants to express themselves, build confidence, and develop healthier coping mechanisms.

The CEO of Tink Tank, Tawd Dorenfeld, will be showcasing artwork created by their artists and showing some live demonstrations of the mentorship process - from idea origination to final product. Interested participants will also be invited to tour the studio in the future and participate in a remote session to create artwork of their own.


